Dear Parishioners:

The Feast of the Epiphany is often the limit for Christmas decorations. Many people use this feast as a marker or divider of time. Before the Epiphany the Christmas lights remain out and the trees up. After the Epiphany trees appear on the curbside or in special pickup locations. Ladders come out and strings of lights find their way back into storage.

In some cases, families maintain a religious tradition; and, just as the wise men “opened their treasures and offered the infant Jesus gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh,” they exchange gifts and actually call the Epiphany “little Christmas.”

As a parish we too will mark the Epiphany as a divider of time. We wish to look forward to 2013 and all that it will bring forth from our parish community. And just as the Bible celebrates the gifts of the Magi, we too wish to celebrate and exchange some special gifts that are within us, namely Jesus Christ, children and young people, ministry, and prayer.

Jesus Christ is the greatest gift. “God so loved the world that in the fullness of time he sent his only Son to be our savior.” This gift is the image of God. (“He who sees me sees the Father.”) He is in our midst! Most Catholics believe that it is possible to have a personal relationship with Jesus, but not all. I encourage each of you to celebrate the gift of Jesus Christ and to celebrate your friendship/relationship with him.

Children are a gift from God. They are sent into our midst. Parents, grandparents, extended families, and the Church community are asked to raise them – to nurture them and guide them. Our teenagers are also a gift to the church. They have enthusiasm and excitement. They help us see old truths but in new ways. They add life to our parish.

Ministry is a gift. The word itself developed from a Greek word which means to serve. We are constantly invited to serve or help others. The fact that ministry is in our midst is another way in which God shows care to his people.

Prayer is a gift sent by God to help us remain in relationship. We pray as individuals and we pray as a parish community.

During 2013 we will celebrate each of these gifts in our midst. And in a very real sense it will be an exchange of gifts. The Lord gives us these gifts, but in return we offer these gifts to God and to each other. May our celebrations of these gifts in 2013 be vibrant and joyful and precious!



YEAR OF FAITH CORNER

The Vatican II document *Gaudium et Spes*, the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, says, "The laity are called to participate actively in the entire life of the church; not only are they to animate the world with the spirit of Christianity, they are to be witnesses to Christ in all circumstances and at the very heart of the human community." (GS §43). Ask yourselves this question, "How can I be a better witness to Christ in all circumstances?" In other words, "How can I be an authentic Catholic all year round?" This might mean learning something new about our relationship with God or about some Church teachings and why they exist. It might mean praying more, sharing more with others your reason for being Catholic, or finding out how you can use your God-given talents and resources to serve God.






ADULT FAITH FORMATION

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CONGRESS 2013

The L.A. Religious Education Congress (RECongress) is the largest annual gathering of its kind in the world. The four-day event is held at the Anaheim Convention Center and is sponsored by the Los Angeles Office of Religious Education. RECongress is open to people of all vocations and different faiths.

Youth Day (February 21, 2013) – Congress opens on Thursday with a day-long event for high school youth. 


