



He called the Church to a “new evangelization – new in its ardor, methods, and expression.” In other words, in order to help people encounter and know Jesus Christ, we need to have new enthusiasm for bringing others to him, use new ways of helping others encounter him, and speak about him in new and meaningful ways.




YEAR OF FAITH 2012-2013



The holidays are well behind us; the year stretches out ahead. And what sort of year will it be? To judge by the words of Jesus in today’s Gospel, it will be “a year acceptable to the Lord.” And Jesus surely didn’t mean only the next three hundred sixty-five days facing his listeners at that time.

When Jesus announced the “arrival” of God’s favor, it was a message for all time, for every year. Similarly, we read today in Nehemiah how the people gathered with solemnity to hear God’s word as though for the first time. They listened, and then fell to the ground and wept. But the prophet said, “Today is holy . . . do not be sad, and do not weep.”



LECTURE ON ECUMENISM AND ENGAGEMENT WITH WORLD RELIGIONS

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 7TH, AT 7:00 P.M.

This will be the second in a series of four lectures at St. John's Seminary examining the impact of the Second Vatican Council. The lecture will be presented by a panel including Father Alexei Smith, Rabbi Michael Lotker, Mr. Shakeel Syed, and others. In recent years St. John's Seminary has had several rabbis as adjunct faculty member. Among our students we have had men and women from Protestant and Eastern Christian traditions. This would have been unthinkable when St. John's was founded in 1939, unthinkable when the Second Vatican Council opened in 1962, yet now is accepted as a matter of course and a source of blessing. The panelists will reflect on how our Church and world are different today because of the declarations of Vatican II on Ecumenism and on Judaism and other world religions. TEACHING KIDS TO BE SAFE AROUND STRANGE ANIMALS

We've all had the experience of someone else's dog approaching us. Uncertainty about the dog's intent can be frightening, especially to young children. The ASPCA website provides parents with advice on teaching their children to read a dog's body language and to identify signs that it wants to be left alone. The website also helps parents teach their children how to protect themselves from an overexcited pet by demonstrating the basics of dog bite prevention, such as rolling into a ball, protecting hands and face and calling for help, rather than running or screaming if chased by a dog. - Si entrar n si la orden pida los nombres y números de placa de los agentes y dígales que usted no da su consentimiento para que entren.
- Tome los nombres, dirección y teléfono de aquellas personas que sean testigos de este acontecimiento.
- Si el agente se lleva algo de su casa, solicite un recibo de todo lo que se lleve.

EL TIEMPO



el rostro en la tierra y lloraban. Pero el profeta decía: “Este día está dedicado al Señor... no estén tristes”.


