Dear Parishioners:

It's Super Bowl Sunday! Get out the chips and dip. Is the chili filling the bowls? Is the HD TV as sharp as ever, bringing the action into your home? Are you in a pool that might pay off at the end of each quarter?

America loves this day. Perhaps it is the secular equivalent to our Catholic celebration of Easter. Everybody is watching, even those who don't much care about football for the rest of the year. Families and friends gather in joy to celebrate together. Good and evil (depending on who you are rooting for) will tussle. And we are all watching to see who wins. On Easter, of course, we know the adversaries: Satan and violence vs. God's own vulnerable and loving Son. Although Good Friday might suggest that Satan and violence have won the first half, we are well aware by the "third day" who wins. This knowledge, if nothing else, reassures us of whom our favorite ought to be – the way of Jesus Christ and not the lure of pleasure or consumerism or the evil of being disheartened by the existence of sickness and ungodly treatment all around us.

Half the fun of watching the Super Bowl is watching the commercials. Some are legendarily clever and delight us. Others are shamefully self-promotional. But watch with a critical eye. Don't some carry the underdog theme of overcoming (a bit of David vs. Goliath)? And others reveal a hint of striving to be better than who we are? Our critical abilities ought to see the religious stories of "fall" and "redemption" that often underlie the storyline of these very expensive advertisements.

I'm looking forward to watching the game. As any good liturgy it starts with an opening hymn (Star Spangled Banner) and procession. (Isn't the precise timing of the jet fly by a high tech version of our cross and candles?). The Liturgy of the Word consists of the commentators recalling some of the great stories of previous Super Bowls. The collection occurs based on the type of "pool" being held. The Big Half Time show is the musical accompaniment and the meal allows us communion. And at the very end, the champion is blessed with the Lombardi trophy.

It is my hope that you enjoy the "liturgy" of the Super Bowl. But even more so, I hope that you might notice some of the deeper, valuable human themes that sneak their way into this ultimate secular celebration, because it is my belief that the divine or the sacred is often revealed from within that which is most secular.


Bilingual Liturgy of the Word services with distribution of ashes will be offered at 4:00, 4:30, 5:00, and 5:30 p.m. in the church.

YEAR OF FAITH CORNER

The five pastoral priorities that Archbishop Gomez outlined in his Pastoral Letter on the New Evangelization in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles are:

1. Education in the faith
2. Promote vocations to the priesthood and to religious and consecrated life
3. Foster our universal Catholic identity and cultural diversity
4. Proclaim the Gospel of life and promote a culture of life
5. Defend and strengthen marriage and the family

This week we discuss the first priority of education in the faith.

We've all heard the saying, "You learn something new every day." This also applies to our faith. No matter where we are in our faith journey, there is always something more that we can learn about our faith. Archbishop Gomez calls us to learn "*what we believe as Catholics and why we believe* these things. Let us also learn *what difference these beliefs should make* in our lives and in our world."

He encourages us to do this by learning about new ways of praying, especially with the Gospels, and developing "the habit of life-long learning in our faith."

The Second Vatican Council tells us that we all are called to holiness, to be set apart for God. In other words, we are meant to be saints. So how can we grow in holiness and become living saints? One way is by learning how to deepen our relationship with God through prayer and by learning about what He calls us to do and why.

Over the next few weeks we will continue these brief discussions about each of these priorities and how we, the People of God in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, can live these out.
