Dear Parishioners:

## THE YEAR OF FAITH

On Easter Sunday we renewed our Baptismal Promises. As the priest asked us questions about what we believe and in whom we believe, we all declared, “I do!” Did you know that those statements that he asked were from the Apostles’ Creed?

Today we begin our brief look into the Creed, beginning with its first statement: “I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.”

In that brief statement so much is said about who God has revealed Himself to be. One thing that we must remember is that God is infinite and we are finite. That means that we can never fully understand God because He is so much greater than we are. But out of His love for us, He reveals Himself to us so that we can be in a relationship with Him. Language is limited and will never fully capture who God is, but it can certainly point us in His direction.

This first statement says that God is the creator of the universe and all it contains, both the physical and the spiritual (“all things visible and invisible”). His love, which is infinite and overflowing, poured out into creation and is shared with us so that we might personally know His love.

He is called “Father” because in the ancient world, the father was thought to be the source of life. Although biology has helped us understand life more deeply, we still hold onto this idea of a father because Jesus, the Son of God, revealed God to us as our Father. But remember, God is beyond male and female. “God is pure spirit in which there is no place for the difference between the sexes” (Catechism of the Catholic Church 370)

More teachings on this brief statement can be found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church nos. 198-421. There is so much there about our faith, about our relationship with God and who God has created us to be, that it would be a shame to not even browse through it. Enjoy the read, but most of all, enjoy knowing more about God and knowing Him more.

### EL AÑO DE LA FE

El Domingo de Pascua renovamos nuestras Promesas Bautismales. El sacerdote nos pregunta acerca de lo que creemos y en que creemos, y todos contestamos: “si creo”. ¿Sabias que aquellas preguntas que nos hicieron, fueron del Credo de los Apóstoles?

Hoy damos una breve mirada dentro del Credo, comenzando con esta primera declaración que dice: “creo en Dios Padre todo poderoso, creador del cielo y de la tierra...”

En esa breve declaración se dice mucho acerca de “Quien es Dios” y nos revela quien es “El”.

Algo que debemos recordar es que Dios es Infinito y nosotros finitos. Que significa que nosotros nunca podremos entender completamente a Dios, ya que “El” es mucho mas grande que nosotros. Pero en su amor por nosotros, “El” se nos revela así mismo, y de esta manera podemos tener una relación con “El”. El lenguaje es limitado y nunca captaríamos completamente quien es Dios, pero podemos tener la certeza de que puede dirigirnos hacia “El”.

Esta primera declaración dice que Dios es el creador del Universo y de todo lo que hay en el; ambos lo físico y lo espiritual (“todo lo visible y lo invisible”). Su amor infinito, se derrama en su creación y es compartido con nosotros, y de esta manera podremos conocer su amor personalmente.

El es Llamado “Padre”, porque en la antigüedad, el padre era fuente de vida. Aun cuando la biología nos ha ayudado a entender la vida mas profundamente, aun nos detenemos en esta idea de un padre porque Jesús, el “Hijo de Dios”, nos revelo a Dios como nuestro Padre. Pero recuerda Dios es mas que masculino y femenino. “En la pureza del espíritu de Dios” no hay lugar para la diferencia entre los sexos (Catecismos de la Iglesia Católica 370).

Aprende mas acerca de esta breve declaración buscando en el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica en los Numerales 198 - 421, ahí hay mucho mas acerca de nuestra fe, acerca de nuestra relación con Dios y para lo que “fuimos creado por Dios”, seria una verdadera lastima ni siquiera hojearlo. Disfruta la lectura, pero mas que todo disfruta conociendo mas acerca de Dios y conociendo mas de El.

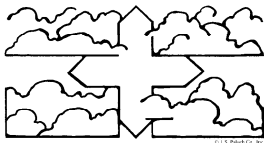

## CONSECUENCIAS DE VIVIR UN NOVIAZGO CON VIOLENCIA...

- Con el tiempo, la autoestima se debilita y vienen consecuencias muy gruesas en el ámbito personal.
- Cuando no te quieres a ti mismo dejas que cualquiera, en este caso el agresor te haga como quiera.
- Puedes llegar a creer que te mereces ser tratada o tratado así, pero no es verdad.
- Podrías llegar a pensar que nadie más te va a querer, pero no es así.

### Supera un noviazgo con violencia:

- Aléjate de la persona quien te hace daño físico o psicológico.
- Busca soporte moral en tu familia.
- Solicita el apoyo de un psicólogo que te ayude recuperar tu autoestima.

### Recuerda:

La violencia es una conducta aprendida, previa a la formación de pareja y no cambia espontáneamente por la voluntad o las personas, requiere un trabajo de cambio orientado por especialistas.

Celar quiere decir 'cuidar' y no aprisionar a una persona, los celos no son una demostración de amor, representan un abuso de poder, posesividad, control, prohibiciones, amenazas; encubren una baja autoestima, inseguridad y desconfianza que tienen que ver con la historia del sujeto y no lo que haga o no haga su pareja. Por eso, aunque consiga dominarla o encerrarla no deja de manifestar sus celos, distorsionando situaciones o haciendo acusaciones desde su imaginación.

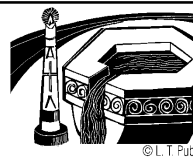
