THE YEAR OF FAITH

Last week we discussed what the sacrament of penance and reconciliation (confession) is all about. This week, we'll go into the most common way of celebrating the sacrament.

Typically, before actually confessing sins to a priest, the penitent (the one seeking to go to confession) does an examination of conscience. This examination of conscience is meant to help the penitent know how they have sinned. As an aid in doing this examination of conscience, some people use the Ten Commandments, others use the Beatitudes, some use prayer books that come with an examination of conscience, while others would use an iPhone/Android phone app called "Confession: A Roman Catholic App" that gives instruction on how to celebrate the sacrament of confession.

After doing a thorough examination of conscience, the penitent would go to the priest, let him know when their last confession was, and then tell him the sins that they remember. The priest might give some words of counsel to help deal with some of the things that were confessed. Then he'll give the penitent a penance to help them get into the habit of interior conversion, letting their hearts continually come closer to God's, which is expressed through an outward action such as prayer or a good deed. When the penitent receives the penance, they say their Act of Contrition (prayer of sorrow), and then receive absolution from the priest. After the prayer of absolution, the priest dismisses the penitent to do their penance and to go in the peace of Christ.

It's a good idea to celebrate this sacrament at least once a year. Others celebrate it every Advent and every Lent, while others would go more frequently. Regardless of how many times a year we go, what's important is that we not put off for a later time our celebration of this sacrament if we know that we are in a state of mortal sin. If we know that we have, through our sin, willingly separated ourselves from God, and if we are truly sorry for it, then we need to go to confession as soon as possible in order to experience God's forgiveness and His call to a conversion of heart.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION

INFORMATION FOR 2013—2014

The Religious Education Office is currently closed and will reopen on August 19th.

At that time we will be accepting registrations for all families with students in grades 1 through 8 for continuing religious education including 1st Communion preparation. Classes will begin the 3rd week of September and the cost is \$100 per student for elementary and \$110 for Jr. High students (7th / 8th grades). Our classes take place during the weekdays on Mondays, Tuesdays, or Thursdays from 4:00 to 5:15 p.m. or 5:45 to 7:15 p.m. depending on your student's grade in the fall.

You must be a registered member of our parish and bring a copy of your child's Baptism certificate to register for classes.

We will not accept registration for 1st graders without a copy of their Baptism certificate (if they have been Baptized).

When the office reopens on August 19th the office hours will be Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays from 3:00 to 7:00 p.m.

RITE OF INITIATION FOR CHILDREN

Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA) will begin a children's catechumenate in September. The children's catechumenate will be for school age children (1st grade through 12th grade) that have not been baptized and need to complete all their sacraments.

The catechumenate is also for youth between 8th grade and 12th grade that have been baptized, but need to complete their sacraments of initiation (Holy Communion and Confirmation).

Anyone 17 years of age and older would join the adult initiation program.

The children's catechumenate is a two year process and all sacraments will be completed. This program is now forming. This is a wonderful opportunity for your child to be part of a new program and build a lifelong relationship with the Lord. ATTENTION ALL CATHOLICS - SB-131

Archbishop Gomez is asking all Catholics to contact their Assembly members and Senators and urge them to vote "No" on Senate Bill 131. Simply tell your elected officials to vote "No" because this legislation fails to protect all victims of childhood sexual abuse, discriminates against Catholic schools and other private employers, and puts the social services and educational work of the Church at risk. Background on SB-131

1. Senate Bill 131, now before the California Legislature, would suspend for one year a deadline (called a "statute of limitations") to give childhood sexual abuse victims the chance to sue their abusers' employers for damages resulting from their abuse.
2. SB-131 is not good legislation because it does not protect all children. In fact, the bill only allows lawsuits to be filed by children who were abused in religious and other private schools and organizations such as the YMCA or Little League. Children who were abused by public school teachers or other public employees are specifically **not protected** by SB 131. That means this legislation offers no protection for the 92 percent of California's children who attend public schools or for children in foster care or in other public settings.
3. SB-131 unfairly targets only Catholic-run and other private institutions because it only allows lawsuits against private schools and organizations and specifically exempts public schools and other public institutions. The sexual abuse of children is a social reality. It is not limited to private institutions. Any legislation that seeks to deal with this grave problem should be applied to protect victims in all institutions in society — public and private — equally.
4. SB-131 does nothing to increase penalties against the actual abusers of children. The bill allows for monetary damages to be imposed on private employers. But it does not impose any civil or criminal penalties on the perpetrator.

AÑO DE LA FE

La semana pasada hablamos a cerca de lo que es el sacramento de la penitencia y reconciliación (confesión). Esta semana, compartiremos la forma más común de celebrar este sacramento.



AÑO DE LA FE²⁰¹²⁻²⁰¹³

Normalmente, antes de confesar nuestros pecados a un sacerdote, el penitente (el que se va a confesar) hace un examen de conciencia.

Este examen de conciencia es para ayudar al penitente a reconocer sus pecados. Como un medio para hacer este examen de conciencia, algunas personas usan los diez mandamientos, otros utilizan las Bienaventuranzas, algunos utilizan libros de oración que vienen con un examen de conciencia, mientras que otros utilizan una aplicación de su teléfono, iPhone/Android llamada “Confesión: A Roman Catholic App” que da instrucciones sobre cómo celebrar el Sacramento de la confesión.

Después de hacer el examen de conciencia, el penitente va con el sacerdote, y le dice cuando fue su última confesión, y después le dice los pecados que recuerda. El sacerdote puede darle algunas palabras de consuelo para ayudarlo o animarlo a mejorar su vida con relación a lo que ha confesado. Entonces el sacerdote, le dará una penitencia para ayudarlo a desarrollar el hábito de conversión interior, dejando así, que sus corazones se acerquen continuamente a Dios, que se expresa a través de una acción exterior como la oración o una buena obra. Cuando el penitente recibe la penitencia, dice el Acto de Contrición (oración de arrepentimiento), y luego recibe la absolución del sacerdote. Después de la oración de absolución, el sacerdote despedirá al penitente para que vaya y realice su penitencia en la paz de Cristo.

Es bueno celebrar el sacramento cuando menos una vez al año. Otros lo celebran cada Adviento y cada Cuaresma, mientras que otros prefieren recibirla más frecuentemente. Independientemente de esto, lo que es importante es que no aplazemos por mucho tiempo la celebración de este Sacramento, sobre todo si sabemos que estamos en pecado mortal. Si sabemos que a través de nuestro pecado, nos hemos separado voluntariamente de Dios, y nos hemos arrepentido verdaderamente, tenemos que ir a la confesión lo más pronto posible para experimentar el perdón de Dios y su llamado a una conversión de corazón.

Para más información sobre el sacramento de la penitencia y reconciliación, pueden leer los números 1420-1498 del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, o un resumen en los números 1485-1498. La próxima semana veremos el segundo sacramento de sanación: La Unción de los Enfermos.


