THE YEAR OF FAITH

What is the difference between evangelization and catechesis?

Simply put, evangelization is proclaiming the Good News to the whole world. It is about bringing people to meet and fall in love with the risen Christ. This can be done through our words, our deeds, and the way we live our lives.

The mission of the Church is evangelization. After his resurrection, Jesus said, “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:19-20) Jesus left us with the responsibility of bringing people into a relationship with God.



Catechesis plays a role in developing this relationship. It is about instructing people who are already in a relationship with God so that they can develop “a living, explicit and active faith enlightened by instruction” (*Christus Dominus* §14). The catechist must give instruction so that it is clear and understandable to the particular listeners. Catechesis is a life-long process because there is so much more that we can learn about our faith. What we learn about our faith ultimately helps us in deepening our relationship with God and with His people.

This is the last Year of Faith article in the bulletin. Thank you for allowing me to share these catechetical moments with you these past several months. As we come to the end of the Year of Faith, please remember to foster that curiosity about our faith and learn more about it everyday. If the God who loves us always wants to know us deeply, it’s only fair to respond with that same desire to know and love Him deeply.


ADULT FAITH FORMATION CLASSES



WHAT IS CATHOLIC ANNULMENT?

To understand annulment, it's best to begin with the Church's definition of sacramental marriage:

- The marriage must be celebrated in a ceremony that is legally acceptable in the eyes of the Church;
- Both parties must be free to marry each other;
- Each partner must intend to accept God's plan for married life; and
- Each partner must have the physical and psychological ability to live out the consent of marriage.

If any requirements are not present at the beginning, after careful investigation, the Church may declare the marriage invalid. According to the Church, only when God is the divine "third partner" in the union of husband and wife can the relationship truly be a sacramental marriage.

An annulment is not a "Catholic divorce." It is a declaration by the Church that something critical was missing from the beginning that prevented the marriage from being valid (even though a civil marriage existed). Individuals can seek annulment after a legal dissolution of marriage.




